

**SAINT HELENA, NAPA RIVER  
CONTINUING AUTHORITY, SECTION 206**

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The project area is located approximately 70 miles north of San Francisco, in the city of St. Helena, Napa County, California. The proposed project's boundaries are approximately one mile downstream (south) and three quarters of a mile upstream (north) from the Pope Street Bridge. The project width would vary, from approximately 200 to 1000 feet, depending on stream reach. The proposed project would provide resident and migratory habitats for Federally listed threatened and endangered species by reconnecting approximately two miles of the Napa River with restored riparian and upstream habitat adjacent to the Napa River. The City of St. Helena is the non-Federal sponsor.
