

**WILDCAT CREEK RESTORATION
CONTINUING AUTHORITY, SECTION 1135**

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The proposed Wildcat Creek Restoration project is located 15 miles northeast of the City of San Francisco in North Richmond, an unincorporated area between the City of San Pablo and the San Francisco Bay, in the northwest portion of Contra Costa County, California. Wildcat Creek is currently an urban stream that provides drainage for a long, narrow basin encompassing approximately eleven square miles. The creek has a history of rapid change, due primarily to various and competing land use practices that have had dramatic impacts on habitat value, erosion, and sedimentation rates. The proposed project would remove barriers to fish passage, increase natural sustainability, improve riparian habitat, reduce sedimentation in low flow channels, and increase natural vegetation.
