

**ARROYO MOCHO
CONTINUING AUTHORITY, SECTION 206**

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: Arroyo Mocho is located in the city of Livermore, in Alameda County, about 45 miles southeast of San Francisco, California. Severe erosion of the stream banks has destroyed riparian habitat along the creek. The city of Livermore would like to initiate a Section 206 habitat restoration study under Continuing Authorities Program (CAP), but new criteria for CAP funding has precluded initiation of the study phase.
