

**McINNIS PARK RESTORATION
CONTINUING AUTHORITY, SECTION 206**

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The project is located in Marin County approximately 20 miles north of San Francisco. It is bounded to the north by Miller Creek, to the west by the McInnis Golf Park and the Las Gallinas Valley Wastewater Treatment Plant, to the south by Lower Gallinas Creek, and to the east by San Pablo Bay. The project area is comprised of approximately 200 acres of diked wetland cells, former tidal wetlands bounded by levees and isolated from tidal action. These cells have limited ecological value in their present state. The primary objective of the project is the regeneration of the approximately 200 acres of habitat for Federally listed threatened and endangered species.

FY 05 ACCOMPLISHMENTS: No significant accomplishments in FY04 and FY05 due to insufficient funding.

FY 06 ACCOMPLISHMENTS: If funding becomes available, establish Without Project Conditions (F3) and work toward completion of a draft Detailed Project Report (DPR). DPR is scheduled for completion in FY07.

ISSUES AND OTHER INFORMATION: The Section 206 CAP project was initiated in 2001 with the creation of the Preliminary Restoration Plan. Proposed restoration features include redistribution of on-site dredged material and potential beneficial use of additional dredged material, construction of a new inland levee, breaching of Las Gallinas and Miller Creek levees, removal of artificial drainage ditches and planting of native upland, wetland, and transition vegetation to restore the site to tidal wetlands.
