

**NAPA VALLEY WATERSHED MANAGEMENT
GENERAL INVESTIGATIONS**

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The Napa Valley Watershed is located within the northern portion of the San Pablo Bay drainage basin in Napa County, California. The purpose of this study is to complete a watershed analysis of the Napa River Watershed in order to address watershed problems and opportunities through water and related land resource management.

FY07 ACCOMPLISHMENTS: Although the Senate Report language and the Conference Report table zeroed out funding for this project, the local sponsor is interested in continuing with the study. The San Francisco District is working with the non-Federal sponsor, and is requesting that limited funds be provided to the Corps to prevent the study from being shut down in FY08.

FY08 ACCOMPLISHMENTS: With funding, work will continue on the development of the *Napa Valley Watershed Report: A Foundation for Resources Management and Restoration*. This work will include salmonid migration monitoring, aquatic habitat, floodplain complexity and large woody debris dynamics evaluation, and predator sampling.

ISSUES AND OTHER INFORMATION: The Napa County Board of Supervisors appointed a Napa Valley Watershed Conservancy Board and Technical Review Panel to assist in study development. These locally organized and lead entities are critical to the on-going development of study tasks and the completion of the watershed report.
