

**SULPHUR CREEK
CONTINUING AUTHORITY, SECTION 206**

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION: The study area is approximately 70 miles north of San Francisco, in the City of St. Helena, Napa County, California. The proposed project would provide rearing, resident, and migratory habitats for Federally listed threatened and endangered species. The project would reconnect the Napa River with restored riparian and upstream habitat located along Sulphur Creek. The City of St. Helena is the non-Federal Sponsor. Lack of funding since FY04 has suspended progress of the feasibility phase study.
