


VICINITY MAP



The project area, which extends from the mouth of the Pajaro River to Murphy's Crossing and from the Salispuedes Creek confluence to Brown's Valley Road in Corralitos.




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SHEET 3 of 4

The Salspuedes Creek Confluence Zone, which begins 3500 ft downstream of the confluence with the Pajaro River at the Southern Pacific railroad bridge and extends to 500 ft upstream of the confluence. This zone is bordered by the cities of Watsonville and Pajaro. Sandbars #8 to #15 are located in this zone and are shown as mapped by the Santa Cruz County Department of Public Works Drainage Maintenance Division for 2000/2001. The County mapped a total of 44 sandbars on the Pajaro River between Highway 1 and Murphy's Crossing.



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
